Tourist Attractions in Vancouver Area

Best Things to See and Do in Vancouver:

1. Tour with the Vancouver Trolley Company (hop-on, hop-off, 32 stops)
2. Stanley Park (nature park)
3. Gastown (historic original settlement of Vancouver, dining, shops)
4. Vancouver Lookout (observation deck)
5. Canada Place - Canada Pavilion - Convention Center - Harbour Centre (shopping, dining)
6. Granville Island (public market, shops, dining)
7. Capilano Suspension Bridge Park & Cliffwalk (ten minutes from downtown)
8. Grouse Mtn (zip-line, mtn hiking) Skyride cable-car & The Observatory Restaurant
9. Whistler-Blackcomb (Peak 2 Peak 360-degree Gondola)
10. FlyOver Canada (eight-minute flyover simulator)
11. Vancouver Food Tour (Gastown & Chinatown tasting tours)
12. Dr. Sun Yat-Sen Classical Chinese Garden (Chinatown)

Stanley Park

Sprawling urban park with scenic seawall. Vancouver's largest urban park boasts beaches, trails, scenic seawall & family-friendly attractions. A must see! Free.

Lynn Canyon Park & Suspension Bridge

This is a 617-acre forest park featuring hiking trails, swimming holes, and a towering suspension bridge overlooking the canyon. Worth the visit. Free.

Capilano Suspension Bridge

Landmark bridge perched in the treetops: Built in 1889, this lengthy (137 metres) treetop bridge offers scenic views of the forest below. A popular tourist area, and priced as such.

Grouse Mountain

Summit with ski trails & city views (take the gondola up): 1,200-metre mountain offering activities such as skiing & hiking plus sweeping views of Vancouver. A must see! Plan on a few hours, or 1/2 a day, to overlook all of the lower mainland - especially to watch the sunset and lights come on all over the city! Restaurants and activities on top of the mountain.

Burrard Inlet

Killer whales, harbor, whales, and kayaking: Burrard Inlet is a relatively shallow-sided coastal fjord in southwest BC, Canada. Separates the City of Vancouver from North Vancouver.

Museum of Vancouver

City history from First Nations to today: Museum focused on city issues & history, with a strong collection of First Nations art & artifacts.

Vancouver Maritime Museum

Nautical history of the Arctic & Pacific: Museum charting the story of Pacific & Arctic waterways, with exhibits & an Arctic exploration ship.

Gastown

Steam Clock, souvenirs & trendy eateries: Lively Gastown is known for its whistling Steam Clock and mix of souvenir shops, indie art galleries and decor stores in Victorian buildings. A trendy food and drink scene includes chic cocktail. Worth the visit. Free. Key area for tourists and shopping for souvenirs, as well as high quality items.

Granville Island

Shopping, drinks, and art: Granville Island is a peninsula and shopping district in Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada. It is located across False Creek from Downtown Vancouver, under the south end of the Granville Street. Worth the visit. Free.

Canada Place

Iconic convention centre/ferry terminal: Built to look like a ship, this iconic complex houses a convention centre, hotel & ferry terminal.

The Grouse Mountain Grind

Uphill trail for challenge-seekers: A 2.9-km trail with some 2,830 steps leading to Grouse Mountain's peak.

Vancouver Lookout

Elevated tower for panoramic city views: Sightseers ascend this tower in a glass elevator to an observation deck with 360° views of the city. Also in the building is the Top of Vancouver revolving restaurant. Good food (upper end quality and price) and fantastic revolving restaurant experience.

Vancouver Island and Victoria (capital of BC)

The capital city of British Columbia is located over on the southern tip of Vancouver Island. There are lots of sites to see in Victoria, as well as all around the coast of the Island. For whale-watching, this is the place to go.

Robson Street

Shopping and ice skating: Robson Street is a major southeast-northwest thoroughfare in downtown and West End of Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada. Its core commercial blocks from Burrard Street to Jervis were also known. Key street for tourists and shopping for souvenirs, as well as high quality items.

Chinatown

Dim sum restaurants & a Chinese garden: Chinatown is known for its buzzing food scene, which includes traditional Asian bakeries, dim sum restaurants and hip cocktail bars. Jars of ginseng and dried fish line the shelves of old-school. Second largest Chinatown in N.A. (after San Fran).

H. R. MacMillan Space Centre

Interactive displays for astronomy buffs: Museum with space-related games & hands-on exhibits, plus a planetarium & an adjacent observatory.

Science World

Geodesic dome with interactive exhibits: Interactive science displays & films for kids from toddlers to early teens, inside a geodesic dome.

Vancouver Aquarium

Educational aquatic exhibits & shows: Popular kid-friendly attraction showcases local & exotic aquatic life with a focus on conservation.

English Bay

Beach and boathouse: English Bay is located in Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada, west of the downtown peninsula and False Creek. It consists of the south side of the Burrard Inlet, extending from Point Grey. A must see! Free.

Queen Elizabeth Park, British Columbia

Seasonal gardens overlooking the city: Urban landmark on a hill featuring manicured gardens, a conservatory, sculptures & sports courts. Worth the visit! Free

Dr. Sun Yat-Sen Classical Chinese Garden

Tranquil green space with Taoist design: Water, plants & rocks are arranged according to Taoist principles to create a serene space. Beautiful, and in the heart of N.A. second largest China town (next to San Francisco). Approx. \$15-19 CDN pp.

VanDusen Botanical Garden

Showcase for seasonal flowers & greenery: Space with ever-changing greenery, flowers & art installations plus fine dining & a casual cafe. A must see! Approx. \$20 CDN pp.

Museum of Anthropology at UBC

Cultural artworks from around the world: Large Arthur Erickson–designed museum at UBC devoted to cultural artifacts from around the world.

Vancouver Art Gallery

Artworks from British Columbia & beyond: Gallery known for its touring exhibits, work by local artists (like Emily Carr) & photo collection.

Nitobe Memorial Garden

Traditional Japanese landscaping & tea: Serene Japanese manicured park with water features plus traditional tea ceremonies at the teahouse.

Playland

Seasonal amusement park & haunted rides: Amusement park with traditional rides open May–Sep, with haunted/terror rides in October.

Bloedel Floral Conservatory

Domed aviary & greenhouse in the park: Lush, glass-domed aviary with 200+ exotic birds & 500+ unique plants set high above the park.

Lost Lagoon

Lagoon with a fountain & birds: Freshwater lagoon in Stanley Park featuring Jubilee Fountain & a variety of birds.

Vancouver Police Museum

Veteran law-enforcement museum: Stalwart museum dedicated to law enforcement, with some 20,000 artifacts in its collection.

Contemporary Art Gallery

Exhibitions by local & global artists: Independent nonprofit public gallery with contemporary works by local & international artists.

Bill Reid Gallery of Northwest Coast Art

Showcase for Canadian Aboriginal art: Space that exhibits sculptures, carvings & more by Bill Reid & other Northwest Coast artists.

Roedde House Museum

Restored Victorian house with docents: This restored, late-Victorian home with tours depicts life at the turn of the 19th century.

Yaletown

Hip restaurants & David Lam Park

Happening Yaletown is known for its old warehouse buildings now home to hip restaurants and cocktail lounges, many with buzzing outdoor terraces, as well as indie fashion and decor boutiques. The trendy restaurant area.

Seawall

Scenic destination for walking & biking: Stone wall to prevent erosion with a waterfront path on top for walking, jogging, cycling & skating. A must see. Free. (Surrounds Stanley park and one end is in English Bay). Highly recommended to rent bicycles in the area and take a ride around the seawall – truly a experience not to forget. You can also pay to go on the horse pulls open trolley around part of the park.

False Creek

Marina: False Creek is a short inlet in the heart of Vancouver. It separates downtown from the rest of the city. It was named by George Henry Richards during his Hydrographic survey of 1856-63.

Coal Harbour

Waterside restaurants & Seawall path: Coal Harbour is a downtown area known for its marina, mountain views, and mix of casual and upscale waterside eateries. Seaplanes take off in the shadow of gleaming condo towers near the modern

Kitsilano Beach

Beach and beach volleyball: Kitsilano Beach is one of the most popular beaches in Vancouver, especially in the warm summer months. Located at the north edge of the Kitsilano neighbourhood, the beach faces out onto English

Lighthouse Park

Groomed trails & old-growth forest: Rugged-terrain forest with groomed trails, old-growth cedar & fir trees, a lighthouse & city views.

Commercial Drive, Vancouver

Shopping: Commercial Drive is a roadway in the city of Vancouver in British Columbia, Canada that extends from Powell Street at its northern extremity, near the waterfront, south through the heart of the “little Italy.” Tourist street with little Italian bistros and stores.
